The protest, going on from April 17th at Columbia University with demands to sever ties to Israel and the companies that fed on war and genocide in Palestine, has already spread across the length and breadth of USA. The students from multitudes of backgrounds, including hundreds of progressive Jewish students, are standing firm braving the immeasurable oppression by the institutions and the US government. With great satisfaction, we also see that hundreds of faculties are boldly coming out against the oppression and in favour of the movement.

We, on behalf of all the left and democratic students organisations of South Asian countries, convey our heartfelt greetings and solidarity to the historic students movement of USA. The protests that are going on in the USA streets for months and now engrossed the vibrant community of students in the campuses, remind us of the great upsurge of public conscience against the Vietnam war.
